



## MONUMENTS

The association must be notified when a marker is to be set in the cemetery. Measurements have to be made for the verification of the marker placement on the proper lot.

**Monuments are to be no larger than 5 feet high, 4 feet wide, and 30 inches deep.**

## ENTRANCE TO CEMETERY

The **east** end of the cemetery is now marked as the **entrance** and the **southwest** end is the **exit**.

## MOWING

We keep the cemetery mowed approximately every 10 days through the summer months. If it is very dry, we don't mow as often. It is an expensive undertaking and increasing fuel and labor costs make it more expensive each year.

**Mowing expense was \$10,925 in 2023.**

## GRAVE SITES

Lots are available for purchase. A full lot (8 graves) is \$4,000; a half lot (4 graves) is \$2,000; one grave is \$500.

## BURIAL REQUIREMENTS

**Funeral home** is required for all burials and cremation urns. The funeral home must notify the association of the death for the burial site to be marked.

**Cremation Sites:** When an urn is buried, a brick or stepping stone must be placed on top of the urn. This makes it possible for a burial to be verified in the future. Two urns may be buried in one plot.

**Pet Burial:** A pet must be cremated and ashes placed in the owner's plot (grave). Ashes can be placed in the urn, casket, or sprinkled on the grave. **No plots or graves will be specifically sold for family pets.**

## DECORATIONS & FLOWERS

We ask that decorations be picked up by **Sunday, June 9, 2024**. When floral decorations wilt or become weatherbeaten, they will be disposed of.
